A Word of Thanks,

I'm pleased to report that Teachers' Supply Closet (TSC) helped more students and teachers in 2013 than since it opened its doors in 2008! TSC distributed more than \$552,000 in free classroom supplies to over 15, 500 students in Berkeley, Charleston and Dorchester counties. On behalf of the children and teachers, we thank donors, sponsors, and TSC volunteers who made this year so successful.

Teachers in Title 1 schools, where 88% or more of the students are on free/reduced lunch, visit TSC once a semester and "shop" for their students. Receiving basic school supplies means these children will more readily focus on the day's lessons — ultimately progressing through grades until they graduate and find employment. It all starts with having a pencil, a notebook, and an eagerness to learn!

Unfortunately, there are too many students and their families that cannot afford supplies and while teachers receive a supply stipend of \$250 a year, many will typically spend approximately \$1,000 of their own money to meet their students' needs. There are better ways to ensure that both children and their teachers achieve the best in academic outcomes and create an educated, skilled workforce.

You can help! Teachers' Supply Closet serves schools that qualify at the 88% federal poverty index and we are working towards targeting those at a 70% poverty index. We need your support to transform young lives and improve the quality of economic life for tri-county residents. 

Clay Hill Elementary School Harleyville Elementary Teachers' Supply Closet (TSC) provided 15,500 children from low-income families with free school supplies in 2013. Our goal is to continue to expand the number of schools we serve in order to provide supplies to all children in need.

TSC's fiscal year is January 1st – December 31st with an operational 2014 budget of \$ 174,336. TSC provided an additional \$37,495 of surplus athletic supplies and other items for children in the tri-county area. With this additional assistance, TSC distributed supplies worth \$552,825 in the tri-county area in 2013.



Our Mission is to serve children in the tri-county area in meeting their educational and creative needs by providing free supplies donated by businesses and individuals.

Donations come from local product drives, and, because TSC is an affiliate of the national Kids In Need Foundation, other items arrive via transport truck. TSC pays for the shipping and uses volunteers to unload and display the supplies in its 2,850 square foot "store", where teachers "shop" for free.
